OBJECTIVES AND INVESTMENT POLICY

The investment objective of the Fund is to closely match the risk and return characteristics of the MSCI Emerging Markets Natural Capital Paris-Aligned Equity Select Index (the "Index") with net dividends reinvested.

The Fund invests in equities (that is, shares and other similar kinds of assets) issued by or relating to companies included in the Index.

Target Market: This Fund is appropriate for investors who plan to invest over the medium to long term; and are looking for a passively managed investment.

Recommendation: This Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 5 years.

The Fund is an Index tracking Fund which seeks to track the risk and return characteristics of the Index by buying all or most of the stocks of the Index. This means it may not hold all the same assets as the Index or hold assets in the same proportion as the Index, and the fund may not match the Index performance.

The Index is designed to meet the standards of the EU Paris Aligned Benchmark ("PAB"), aiming to reduce the weighted average greenhouse gas intensity relative to the MSCI Emerging Markets Index (the "Parent Index") by 50% and reduce the weighted average greenhouse gas ("GHG") intensity by 7% on an annualized basis.

The Index additionally aims to reduce exposure to companies according to select indicators that are associated with adverse impact on natural resources, and to increase exposure to companies that are associated with positive contribution to the environment through their products or services, or through their management of natural-capital related risks.

The Index excludes companies based on exclusion criteria which are incorporated to align with the objectives detailed in the EU PAB, supplemented with exclusions to companies not considered to meet Environmental, Social and Governance ("ESG") criteria selected by the Investment Manager and as detailed in the Supplement.

The Index also excludes companies linked to ecosystem loss and water pollution, and seeks to tilt the screened universe such that, compared to the Parent Index, there is a positive uplift:

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- to companies with revenues from clean technology themes, including alternative energy, energy efficiency, green building, pollution prevention and control, sustainable agriculture and water; and
- ii) in exposure to best-in-class companies in sectors where land use and biodiversity, resource use and emissions, effluents and waste are material topics and the companies have top decile sector-relative management scores.

The Management Company considers that the Fund meets the criteria in Article 8 of the Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation (Regulation EU/2019/2088) to qualify as a financial product that promotes, among other characteristics, environmental or social characteristics. For efficient portfolio management purposes the Fund may invest in derivatives and other financially linked instruments (such as currency forwards and exchange traded futures) to reduce risk, minimise costs or generate additional capital or income. A derivative is a financial contract whose value is derived from other assets.


The shares in the Fund are either accumulating or distributing. If you elect accumulating shares, any income received will always be included in the value of your shares. If you elect distributing shares, any income received will be distributed annually, and you can request either a cash payment or additional shares in the Fund.

Each share class is available as either a hedged or an unhedged class. For each hedged share class the Fund will enter into certain currency-related transactions in order to seek to hedge out currency risk relevant to that class. The hedging strategy may not completely eliminate currency risk and, therefore, may affect the performance of your share classes.

You can buy or sell shares daily (on each business day of the Fund). An application must be received by the Fund's administrator before 2.00pm (Irish time) on the business day prior to the relevant dealing day.

The base currency of the Fund is U.S. Dollar.

Risk and Reward Profile



The risk indicator was calculated incorporating simulated historical data and may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund.

The rating is based upon changes in prices of the equities held by the Fund. The Fund mainly invests in shares of emerging markets that are more likely to experience sharp rises and falls in value.

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Investments in the relevant countries are affected by exchange rate risk, particularly with some emerging markets where the currencies may fluctuate significantly in value.


